The purpose of this report is to seek approval of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Lincolnshire to enter into a National Collaboration Agreement for the coordination of the deployment of officers from the Civil Nuclear Constabulary.

### A. NON-CONFIDENTIAL FACTS AND ADVICE TO THE PCC

#### A1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 1. The Civil Nuclear Constabulary (CNC) is an armed police service created by the Energy Act 2004 responsible for the armed protection of civil nuclear material at various sites across the UK. It is also responsible for the armed protection of certain categories of nuclear material in transit within the UK and internationally.
- 2. As part of the broader police family, the CNC also has a duty to support Home Office police forces in times of national and local need. CNC officers have the full powers of a Constable at licensed sites and 5 Kilometres beyond the boundary

and anywhere whilst escorting material. These powers come from the Energy Act and are limited by statute. This can create complications in rapid deployment when CNC officers are called upon to provide support to Home Office police forces.

3. As a result of the legislative position, the CNC has sought legal advice to ensure that it is in the strongest legal and least bureaucratic position to allow armed CNC officers to move between Home Office police forces. As a result of that advice, it has been recommended that the CNC enter into a Section 22A Collaboration Agreement with all Home Office Police Forces. This will ensure that CNC officers are in the best position to provide armed support should it be requested and authorised to do so.

#### B. **FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

The Local Policing Body maintaining the receiving force will pay the Civil Nuclear Police Authority for the costs of deployed officer's overtime, any necessary accommodation and any costs reasonably incurred as a result of the deployment of the officers under the S.22A Agreement.

#### C. **LEGAL AND HUMAN RIGHTS CONSIDERATIONS**

The Collaboration Agreement is pursuant to Sections 22A to 22C, 23, 23A to 23I and 101 of the Police Act 1996 (as amended by the Policing and Crime Act 2009 and Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011) and Section 59 of the Energy Act 2004.

CNC officers deployed under the Collaboration Agreement will come under the direction and control of the Chief Officer of the receiving force and will have the same powers and privileges as a member of that force.

The agreement in effect provides for an operational contingency whereby armed officers from the CNC would be deployed in an emergency situation.
