# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND PURPOSE OF REPORT**

The business case outlines a solution which will improve data quality for the Niche forces in the East Midland region. Data quality is an issue for many forces, primarily due to the number of stand-alone systems used to hold information and the complexity of that information. This situation is compounded by the fact that criminals will often use variations on their names, dates of birth and addresses to avoid detection.

The introduction of regional NICHE brings together information from four forces with the potential for information about any individual, vehicle or address to have been held separately by one or more forces. Data needs to be matched and any potential data quality issues reduced to a minimum. To achieve this a dedicated regional team is needed which can resolve issues across all forces, to ensure that the data contained within the regional database is of the highest quality, to aid operational deployment and decision making.

The proposal is to create a dedicated regional data quality team to identify and to assess whether information has been accurately provided and entered onto the system. The team will be based in Lincolnshire and provide a resilient resource which can adapt to volumes in any force, whilst having an overall picture of all forces' information.

RECOMMENDATION	That the business case to establish the Regional Data Quality Team is supported.

#### NON-CONFIDENTIAL FACTS AND ADVICE TO THE PCC A.

#### INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND A1.

1. Data quality is an issue for many forces, primarily due to the number of stand-alone systems used to hold information and the complexity of that information. This situation is compounded by the fact that criminals will often use variations on their names, dates of birth and addresses to avoid detection. The information held within

police systems in the East Midlands is no exception to this. The introduction of the regional NICHE system provides the opportunity to share crime and intelligence data across the four forces, providing real operational benefits - but only if data is accurate and up-to-date.

- 2. The proposal is to create a dedicated regional data quality team, which identifies duplicates, and rectifies errors produced either through incorrect data entry or misleading information provided by detained persons. The team will be based in Lincolnshire and provide a resilience that can adapt to volumes in any one force, whilst having an overall picture of all forces' information, including cross border criminals. Whilst there are no actual financial savings in the proposed solution, there will be benefits on increased efficiency and effectiveness for operational staff and improved data quality. The acceptance of this proposal will enable operational staff to research the system knowing that only one individual entity exists, as opposed to the current situation across forces, where information about an individual, vehicle or address may be duplicated or inaccurate.
- 3. This proposal will support the desire to have an effective regional NICHE system that will provide the right information via a single accurate and conclusive search. This will allow informed operational decisions and timely risk assessments that ensure the public are protected. Without this proposal, staff would spend considerably longer ensuring nominal, vehicle or address records are not duplicated within the regional NICHE system, or that there are not similar records with slightly different details. This improved capability and saving in time will provide regional officers with the ability to be more aware of the potential risk a nominal may represent and respond appropriately to ensure the public is protected. It is therefore proposed that Lincolnshire Police collaborates on this piece of work with an initial contribution of 16.5% to the budget with the level of future contributions reviewed annually by the Regional Data Quality Management Board.
- 4. This team has been agreed by the regional Chief Constables and Police and Crime Commissioners. It has been proposed as a 4-year costed project commencing in April 2015, with a review at 18-months.

# A2. LINKS TO POLICE AND CRIME PLAN AND PCC'S STRATEGIES/PRIORITIES

The Lincolnshire Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) has clearly outlined his requirement for officers to be visible and available. This business case will support this by providing an accurate and effective NICHE system that will provide the right information via one accurate and conclusive search.

It will allow informed operational decisions and timely risk assessments that ensure that the public are protected. This improved research capability and saving in time will provide regional officers with the ability to be more aware of the potential risk a nominal may represent and will augment visibility on the streets of each regional force, offering increased reassurance to the communities.

## B. FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

It is proposed that Lincolnshire collaborate on this piece of work with an initial

contribution of 16.5% to the budget with the level of future contributions reviewed annually by the Regional Data Quality Management Board. This would equate as follows:

At the end of 2014/15, financial provision was made for the 4-year costs of this team and placed in a reserve.

The day to day line management will be undertaken by the Lincolnshire RRD Supervisors.

#### E. REVIEW ARRANGEMENTS

The Collaboration can be reviewed on an annual basis, or as determined by the Police and Crime Commissioners or Chief Constables.

#### F. RISK MANAGEMENT

Risk management is undertaken in accordance with the terms of the collaboration through the Regional Data Quality Management Board.
