32/14	Any documentation that you hold with G4 attached to it, mentioned within it etc, I wish to have a copy please?	<p>Section 12 of the FOIA provides an exemption from a public authority's obligation to comply with a request for information where the cost of compliance is estimated to exceed the <i>appropriate limit</i>.</p> <p>The information you have requested is contained within a mixture of emails, electronic files and hard copy documents located within the offices of the Police and Crime Commissioner, the Commercial Partnership Team and Lincolnshire Police. It is estimated that the cost of providing you with the information will be above the amount to which we are legally required to respond i.e. the cost of locating and retrieving the information exceeds the appropriate limit as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004. For the Police and Crime Commissioner, the appropriate limit is £450 which has been calculated to equate to a total of 18 hours of work (i.e. 18 hours @ £25 per hour). The total number of electronic and hard copy documents that relate to, or that mention, G4S is estimated to be in excess of 100,000.
