

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND PURPOSE OF REPORT The Forensic Capability Network (FCN) is essentially a network to enable the police forces to work better nationally to delivery high quality specialist forensic science capabilities.

A. NON-CONFIDENTIAL FACTS AND ADVICE TO THE PCC

A1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

1. The parties to the agreement are PCCs and Chief Constables of all forces in England and Wales.
2. The overarching aim of the collaboration agreement is to enable police forces to work together nationally to deliver high quality, specialist forensic science capabilities; to share knowledge; and to improve resilience, efficiency, quality and effectiveness. The aims and responsibilities are summarised below as:

- 2.1 to enable the Parties to work together nationally to deliver high quality, specialist forensic science capabilities;
- 2.2 to share knowledge and to improve resilience, efficiency, quality and effectiveness within forensic science in law enforcement;
- 2.3 to support and enable a network of forensic science professionals, who will share skills and expertise to improve standards and be able to share workload to increase resilience;
- 2.4 to help to define, co-ordinate and orchestrate forensic science delivery, focus investment and engage with the marketplace to continually improve forensic capabilities across law enforcement;
- 2.5 to deliver a platform and toolset that provides the technology to connect and enhance Police Services' existing forensic capabilities and enables them to share work by using common processes and policies;
- 2.6 to identify and exploit forensic science opportunities so that the Parties can better meet current and future law enforcement challenges;
- 2.7 to achieve and maintain quality forensic science services with efficient, standardised processes, and to act as a single voice with key standards and accreditation stakeholders;
- 2.8 to define, develop and maintain a sustainable and forward-looking commercial marketplace for both traditional and digital forensic science;
- 2.9 to maximise resilience and effectiveness through the design, introduction and maintenance of new ICT platforms, tools, operating models and business change support;
- 2.10 to continue to seek opportunities to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of one or more of the Parties in respect of the provision of forensic science services; and
- 2.11 anything which could be considered incidental or ancillary to any of the aforementioned aims.

A2. LINKS TO POLICE AND CRIME PLAN AND PCC'S STRATEGIES/PRIORITIES

The Agreement links to the Police and Crime Commissioner's objective of "Effective policing, there when you need it and responsive to differing community needs" within the Police and Crime Plan.

B. FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Details of the financial contribution are outlined in the Agreement, specifically within Schedule 2. The budget will be reviewed and approved on an annual basis.

C. LEGAL AND HUMAN RIGHTS CONSIDERATIONS
